BACKGROUND AND PLEADINGS

1. On 26 April 2023, M&A Styles Ltd (“the applicant”) applied to register the trade mark shown on the cover page of this decision in the UK (“the applicant’s mark”). The applicant’s mark was published on 12 May 2023 and registration is sought for the goods and services set out in **Annex 1** of this decision.
2. On 8 August 2023, the applicant’s mark was opposed by Kazim Mohammad Hussain (“the opponent”). The opposition is based on sections 5(2)(a), 5(2)(b), 5(3) and 5(4)(a) of the Trade Marks Act 1994 (“the Act”). Under the section 5(2) and 5(3) grounds, the opponent relies on the following trade marks:

(“the opponent’s first mark”);

DURAFOAM

UK registration no. 3473624

Filing date 9 March 2020; registration date 9 August 2020

(“the opponent’s second mark”); and

DURAFOAM

UK registration no. 3904305

Filing date 24 April 2023; registration date 14 July 2023

(“the opponent’s third mark”).

3. In respect of the section 5(2) and 5(3) grounds, the opponent relies on all of the goods and services for which the above marks are registered. These are set out in **Annex 2** of this decision.

4. By virtue of relying on section 5(2)(a) of the Act, the opponent's position is that the marks at issue are identical and cover similar goods and services. Under section 5(2)(b), the position is that the marks are similar and that the goods and services at issue are identical and/or similar. Under both grounds, the basis for the claims is that these points all lead to a likelihood of confusion.
5. Turning to the section 5(3) ground, the opponent claims that his reputation in all three of its marks is substantial and that use of the applicant's mark would call to mind the opponent's well known marks. It is claimed that this will result in an unfair advantage in favour of the applicant. Further, the opponent's position is that use of the applicant's mark would also be detrimental to his own marks' reputation and/or distinctive character.
6. Lastly, under the section 5(4)(a) ground, the opponent relies on the sign 'DURAFOAM', which he claims to have used throughout the UK since 30 March 2018 in respect of the same goods and services relied upon in the grounds discussed above. Under this ground, the opponent claims to have gained goodwill in the UK and that use of the applicant's mark in respect of its goods and services would misrepresent to consumers that there was some form of commercial link, endorsement or association with the opponent. It is claimed that such misrepresentation would likely result in damage to the opponent's goodwill.
7. The applicant filed a counterstatement wherein denied all of the claims against it.
8. The applicant is unrepresented and the opponent is represented by Mr Muhammad Nadeem. Only the opponent filed evidence. No hearing was requested and neither party filed written submissions in lieu of the same. On this point, it is noted that due to the size of the specifications at issue and the lack of particularisation in respect of the same, the Tribunal requested that the opponent provide submissions in respect of the goods and services comparison. These were provided on 22 December 2025. This decision is taken after careful consideration of the papers.

9. The provisions of the Act relied upon in these proceedings are assimilated law, as they are derived from EU law. Although the UK has left the EU, section 6(3)(a) of the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 (as amended by Schedule 2 of the Retained EU Law (Revocation and Reform) Act 2023) requires tribunals applying assimilated law to follow assimilated EU case law. That is why this decision refers to decisions of the EU courts which predate the UK's withdrawal from the EU.

EVIDENCE

10. The opponent's evidence was provided in the form of a witness statement in his own name dated 28 August 2024. The opponent's evidence is accompanied by three exhibits, being KH01 to KH03, and was adduced in order to prove that his marks enjoy a reputation and that his sign benefits from a protectable goodwill.

11. I do not intend to summarise the opponent's evidence in full here. However, I confirm that I have taken all filed documents into account and will summarise them to the extent that I deem necessary below.

DECISION

Section 5(2): legislation and case law

“(2) A trade mark shall not be registered if because-

(a) it is identical with an earlier trade mark and is to be registered for goods or services similar to those for which the earlier trade mark is protected, or

(b) it is similar to an earlier trade mark and is to be registered for goods or services identical with or similar to those for which the earlier trade mark is protected,

there exists a likelihood of confusion on the part of the public, which includes the likelihood or association with the earlier trade mark.”

12. Section 5A of the Act states as follows:

“Where grounds for refusal of an application for registration of a trade mark exist in respect of only some of the goods or services in respect of which the trade mark is applied for, the application is to be refused in relation to those goods and services only.”

13. An earlier trade mark is defined in section 6 of the Act, the relevant parts of which state:

“(6)(1) In this Act an “earlier trade mark” means –

[...]

(ab) a comparable trade mark (IR) or a trade mark registered pursuant to an application made under paragraph 28, 29 or 33 of Schedule 2B which has a valid claim to seniority of an earlier registered trade mark or protected international trade mark (UK) even where the earlier trade mark has been surrendered or its registration has expired.

(2) References in this Act to an earlier trade mark include a trade mark in respect of which an application for registration has been made and which, if registered, would be an earlier trade mark by virtue of subsection (1)(a) or (b), subject to its being so registered.”

14. Given their filing dates, the opponent's marks all qualify as earlier trade marks in accordance with section 6 of the Act. The opponent's second and third marks did not complete their registration processes more than five years prior to the filing date of the applicant's mark. This means that the use provisions as set out in section 6A of the Act do not apply to these marks. In respect of the opponent's first mark, this did complete its registration process more than five years prior to the filing of the applicant's mark. While it was open for the applicant to request that the opponent provide proof of use for the same, no such request was made meaning that the use provisions do not apply to this mark either. The consequence of this is that the opponent may rely on all of the goods and services for which all three of his marks are registered.

15. The following standard summary of the principles applicable to the assessment of the likelihood of confusion was approved by the Supreme Court in *Iconix Luxembourg Holdings SARL v Dream Pairs Europe Inc & Anor*, [2025] UKSC 25:

(a) the likelihood of confusion must be appreciated globally, taking account of all relevant factors;

(b) the matter must be judged through the eyes of the average consumer of the goods or services in question, who is deemed to be reasonably well informed and reasonably circumspect and observant, but who rarely has the chance to make direct comparisons between marks and must instead rely upon the imperfect picture of them he has kept in his mind, and whose attention varies according to the category of goods or services in question;

(c) the average consumer normally perceives a mark as a whole and does not proceed to analyse its various details;

(d) the visual, aural and conceptual similarities of the marks must normally be assessed by reference to the overall impressions created by the marks bearing

in mind their distinctive and dominant components, but it is only when all other components of a complex mark are negligible that it is permissible to make the comparison solely on the basis of the dominant elements;

(e) nevertheless, the overall impression conveyed to the public by a composite trade mark may, in certain circumstances, be dominated by one or more of its components;

(f) and beyond the usual case, where the overall impression created by a mark depends heavily on the dominant features of the mark, it is quite possible that in a particular case an element corresponding to an earlier trade mark may retain an independent distinctive role in a composite mark, without necessarily constituting a dominant element of that mark;

(g) a lesser degree of similarity between the goods or services may be offset by a greater degree of similarity between the marks, and vice versa;

(h) there is a greater likelihood of confusion where the earlier mark has a highly distinctive character, either per se or because of the use that has been made of it;

(i) mere association, in the strict sense that the later mark brings the earlier mark to mind, is not sufficient;

(j) the reputation of a mark does not give grounds for presuming a likelihood of confusion simply because of a likelihood of association in the strict sense; and

(k) if the association between the marks creates a risk that the public might believe that the respective goods or services come from the same or economically linked undertakings, there is a likelihood of confusion.

Identity of the marks

16. It is a prerequisite of section 5(2)(a) of the Act that marks be identical. Clearly, the marks at issue are identical as the applicant's mark and all of the opponent's marks are for the word only 'DURAFOAM'. The section 5(2)(a) ground may, therefore, proceed.

Comparison of goods and services

17. The competing goods and services are set out in the Annexes of this decision. As set out above, the opponent has provided specific submissions setting out which of its own goods and services are considered similar or identical to the goods and services in the applicant's specification. I have given this due consideration. As for the applicant, it has made no comment in respect of this point beyond the bare denial set out in its counterstatement.

18. When making the comparison, all relevant factors relating to the goods and services in the specifications should be taken into account. In the judgment of the Court of Justice of the European Union ("CJEU") in *Canon*, Case C-39/97, the court stated at paragraph 23 that:

"Those factors include, inter alia, their nature, their intended purpose and their method of use and whether they are in competition with each other or are complementary".

19. The relevant factors identified by Jacob J. (as he then was) in the *Treat* case, [1996] R.P.C. 281, for assessing similarity were:

(a) The respective uses of the respective goods or services;

(b) The respective users of the respective goods or services;

- (c) The physical nature of the goods or acts of service;
- (d) The respective trade channels through which the goods or services reach the market;
- (e) In the case of self-serve consumer items, where in practice they are respectively found or likely to be, found in supermarkets and in particular whether they are, or are likely to be, found on the same or different shelves;
- (f) The extent to which the respective goods or services are competitive. This inquiry may take into account how those in trade classify goods, for instance whether market research companies, who of course act for industry, put the goods or services in the same or different sectors.

20. In *Gérard Meric v Office for Harmonisation in the Internal Market*, Case T- 133/05, the General Court stated that:

“29. In addition, the goods can be considered as identical when the goods designated by the earlier mark are included in a more general category, designated by trade mark application (Case T-388/00 *Institut für Lernsysteme v OHIM- Educational Services (ELS)* [2002] ECR II-4301, paragraph 53) or where the goods designated by the trade mark application are included in a more general category designated by the earlier mark.”

Class 20

21. The lists of goods in class 20 of the applicant’s specification and the opponent’s first mark’s specification are extensive. There is a considerable amount of overlap between them and I note that the following terms appear identically throughout them both:

“Cushions; Air cushions; Cushions [furniture]; Chair cushions; Cushions (upholstery); Cushions (Pet -); Japanese floor cushions (zabuton); Baby head support cushions; Inflatable neck support cushions; Accent pillows; Inflatable cushions, other than for medical purposes; Air cushions, not for medical purposes; Air cushions in the nature of furniture [not for medical purposes]; Back support cushions, not for medical purposes; Cushions adapted to support the face [other than for medical use]; Cushions filled with hair; Beds; Beds for animals; Beds for birds; Beds for pets; Beds (Hospital -); Beds incorporating inner sprung mattresses; Beds of wood; Bed bases; Bed rails; Bed slats; Bed frames; Bed heads; Bed chairs; Chair beds; Chairs [seats]; Chair pads; Bed-settees; Camping mattresses; Foam mattresses; Latex mattresses; Inner sprung mattresses; Mattresses; Futon mattresses [other than childbirth mattresses]; Fire resistant mattresses; Beds, bedding, mattresses, pillows and cushions; Feather beds; Bedding, except linen; Bedding for cots [other than bed linen]; Bedding for nursery cots [other than bed linen]; Dog beds; Cat beds; Air mattresses; Air mattresses for use when camping; Air mattresses, not for medical purposes; Inflatable mattresses for use when camping; Inflatable mattresses, other than for medical purposes; Air pillows; Air pillows, not for medical purposes; Bath pillows; Neck pillows; Latex pillows; Bean bag pillows; Head supporting pillows; Inflatable pillows; Inflatable pillows [other than for medical use] for fitting around the neck; Seats; Seats [furniture]; Booster seats; Bench seating; Bath seats; Love seats; High seats [furniture]; Seats for children; Seats of metal; Adjustable seat carriers; Floatable [inflatable] seats; Floating inflatable seats; Furniture incorporating beds; Cots; Cots for babies; Bumper guards for cots, other than bed linen; Infant beds; Children’s beds; Curtain fittings; Fittings for curtains; Curtain hooks; Curtain hooks made of metal; Curtain hooks made of plastics; Curtain poles; Curtain rods; Curtain rails; Curtain rings; Curtain rollers; Curtain runners; Curtain tracks; Curtain tie-backs; Curtain suspension fittings; Curtain suspension devices; Curtain suspending apparatus; Curtain embraces for holding back curtains; Curtain embraces of

plastics for holding back curtains; Curtain embraces of metal for holding back curtains; Curtain drawing devices, other than electrically operated; Bamboo curtains; Hooks (Curtain -); Curtains (Bead -) for decoration; Curtains (Bamboo -); Bead curtains; Bead curtains for decoration; Decorative bead curtains; Indoor blinds, and fittings for curtains and indoor blinds; Display cases; Fitted cupboards; Fitted furniture; Fitted bedroom furniture; Fitted kitchen furniture; Clothes covers; Covers (Garment -) [storage]; Corner protectors of plastics.”

22. Such goods are, therefore, identical. As for the remaining terms in the applicant’s class 20 list of goods, I will assess these below, grouping them where I consider it appropriate to do so.

Stadium cushions; Pet cushions; Soft furnishings [cushions]; Neck support cushions; Cushions [other than for medical use] for supporting infants being examined; Inflatable cushions, not for medical use; Support cushioning for use in car safety seats for babies; Nap mats [cushions or mattresses]; Anti-roll cushions for babies; Head support cushions for babies; Seat pads being parts of furniture; Bean bag cushions; Seat cushions; Stadium seats (Cushions for -).

23. The opponent’s first mark’s specification includes the term “cushions”. This is sufficiently broad so as to cover all of the above goods of the applicant, which are all variously worded terms for different types of cushions. As a result, I find that these goods are identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Plastic mesh cushioning sheets for lining shelves.

24. While I appreciate that the above term is worded differently, it is still essentially a cushion albeit for the lining of a shelf. As such, I consider that much like the goods discussed immediately above, it is encompassed by the opponent’s term of “cushions” in its first mark’s specification. These goods are, therefore, identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Spring assemblies (Non-metallic -) for incorporation into mattresses.

25. The opponent's first mark is registered for the term "bed springs of non-metallic materials". These goods, while worded differently, cover springs used for mattresses and, as such, I find that they are self-evidently identical.

Spring assemblies (Non-metallic -) for incorporation into cushions.

26. Comparing this term against the same term in the opponent's specification that I discussed immediately above, I find that while they are not identical, they are highly similar. I say this because their natures and purposes are the same, both being non-metallic springs used to add bounce or recoil to something, regardless of whether that is a cushion or a mattress. Further, I consider that the trade channels overlap on the basis that a producer of springs for mattresses is also likely to produce and sell springs for cushions. In terms of the user, I consider that this will overlap as both will be sought by manufacturers of home goods (which includes beds and cushions). Overall, I consider that these goods are similar to a medium degree.

Seat pads

27. I consider that the above term essentially describes the same good as the term "chair pads" in the opponent's first mark's specification. They are, therefore, identical.

Mattress pads; Sleeping pads; Sleeping bag pads; Mattress toppers.

28. The above goods are not mattresses as such but are closely associated. These goods will, in my view, overlap in nature and purpose with the opponent's terms of "mattresses" and "cushions" in its first mark's specification on the basis that they

are soft furnishings that will be used to sleep on to ensure the user has a more comfortable sleep. Further, the goods will be available via the same trade channels and selected by the same user. While mattresses will be important to some of the above goods, I am not convinced that their relationship is such that gives rise to a finding that the goods are complementary to one another in the way described by the case law.¹ Overall, I consider that these goods are similar to a medium degree.

Pillows; Scented pillows; Maternity pillows; Throw pillows; Travel pillows; Nursing pillows; Bamboo pillows; Stuffed pillows; Neck-supporting pillows; U-shaped pillows; Memory foam pillows; Storage boxes for pillows [furniture]; Head positioning pillows for babies; Water pillows, other than for medical purposes; Support pillows for use in baby seating; Support pillows for use in baby car safety seats; Neck pillows [other than for medical or surgical use].

29. The opponent's first mark's specification includes the term "beds, bedding, mattresses, pillows and cushions". The pillow aspect of this term is not limited in any way and, therefore, the opponent's term is identical to all of the above, be that self-evidently (in the case of "pillows", for example) or in accordance with the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Seating furniture; Metallic seats; Office seats; Shower seats; Storage boxes for pillows [furniture].

30. The opponent's first mark's specification includes the term "furniture and nursery furniture". This covers any type of furniture and is, therefore, sufficiently broad so as to cover the above goods. They are, therefore, identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Mattress bases; Mattress (Straw –); Straw mattresses; Mattresses made of flexible wood; Portable mattresses for automobiles; Floating inflatable mattresses [airbeds]; Sleeping mats for camping [mattresses]; Mattresses (Spring –); Spring mattresses; Foam camping mattresses; Mattresses [other than childbirth mattresses]; Bed mattresses; Straw mattress; Mattresses [other than child birth mattresses].

31. The opponent's first mark includes the term "mattresses". This is sufficiently broad so as to cover all of the above terms meaning that they are identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*. In respect of the first term listed, if this is not a mattress per se but a base for a mattress, then this is likely to be a product akin to a divan base, for example. On this point, I note that the opponent's first mark also includes the term "divan bases" meaning that such goods would be identical in any event.

Safety cots; Travel cots; Bumper guards for cots, other than bed linen.

32. The above terms fall within the opponent's terms of "cots" and "cot bumpers", both of which are present in its first mark's specification. These goods are, therefore, identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Wooden beds; Beach beds; Divan beds; Adjustable beds; Transportable beds; Air bed lounge; Portable infant beds; Bean bag beds; Inflatable pet beds; Padded furniture; Foldaway beds; Bunk beds; Camp beds; Folding beds; Portable beds; Sofa beds; Water beds.

33. The above goods are all types of beds and given that the opponent's first mark is protected for the term "beds", these goods are clearly identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Rods for beds.

34. In my view, the above term covers something use to secure the mattress of a bed to its frame. The opponent's first mark includes the terms "bed rails" and "bed slats", both of which will, as far as I am aware, cover the same product meaning that these goods are identical. Failing that, these goods are still clearly highly similar on the basis that they overlap in nature, method of use, purpose, trade channels and user.

Curtain pins; Rings (Curtain -); Rods (Curtain -); Support rails for curtains; Rods for net curtains; Support rods for curtains; Curtain holders, not of textile material; Expanding rails of plastics for net curtains; Metal curtain rods; Metal curtain rails; Metal curtain rings; Non-metal curtain rods; Non-metal curtain rails; Non-metal curtain rings; Shower curtain rods; Shower curtain rails; Shower curtain hooks; Shower curtain rings; Rings for curtains; Poles for curtains; Supports for fixing curtain poles; Supports for fixing curtain rods; Supports for supporting curtain poles; Supports for supporting curtain rods; Rails (Curtain -); Rollers (Curtain -); Tie back hooks made of plastics [curtain]; Tie back hooks made of wood [curtain]; Tie back hooks of brass [curtain].

35. The opponents' first mark is registered for the terms "curtain rods", "curtain hooks", "curtain pins", "curtain holders", "curtain poles", "curtain rails", "curtain rings", "curtain rollers", "curtain runners" and "curtain fittings". All of these goods encompass the equivalent goods I have listed above meaning that they are identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Suction pads [fixings].

36. The above goods are, as far as I am aware, used for the purpose of holding something into place by fixing it to a secure location by way of suction. The above term is not limited in any way so can be used to secure many types of goods, be that furniture, cork boards, curtains or any type of window covering. In respect of the latter point, I note that the opponent's first mark includes the term "holders for

use in the securing of window coverings”. This can be a holder that uses suction to secure a window covering in place. Therefore, I consider that these goods can be said to be identical on that basis that, as described above, they can encompass one another if interpreted in the ways I have explained. As such, I find that these goods are identical under the principle outlined in *Meric*.

Tree protectors, not of metal; Tree protectors [tubes] not of metal.

37. The opponent’s first mark’s specification includes the term “hard wood tree stakes”. While not the same as the above term, I do consider them to be similar. The goods differ in nature, method of use and purpose. However, both goods are for use with trees so are likely to be provided by the same undertaking and sought from the same trade channels where they will likely be placed within close proximity of one another. Further, someone looking to stake a tree is also likely to seek to protect it meaning that there is an overlap in user also. The goods are not in competition and neither are they complementary to one another. However, I do consider that the aforementioned overlaps are such to warrant a finding that they are similar to a low degree.

Classes 22, 24 and 37

38. The class 22 and 24 goods as well as the class 37 services in the applicant’s specification all appear identically in the corresponding classes of goods or services in the opponent’s third mark’s specification. Such goods and services are, plainly, identical.

Consideration of the present grounds

39. I would not ordinarily pause at this point to discuss the nature of the grounds relied upon. However, I consider it necessary to do so as the findings above have

presented some issues regarding the way in which the present case has been pleaded.

40. As set out above, I have found the marks at issue to be identical and that a range of the goods and services at issue to also be identical. The difficulty with this is twofold. Firstly, the basis of section 5(2)(a) grounds is that while the marks are claimed to be identical, the goods and services at issue are only *similar*. Secondly, the basis for section 5(2)(b) grounds is that the marks are only *similar* but the goods and services at issue are identical and/or similar. I appreciate that a claim in respect of *identical marks and identical goods and services* would have been more properly pleaded under section 5(1) of the Act.

41. In light of the above, I consider that a pragmatic approach is necessary and appropriate. Firstly, under the section 5(2)(a) ground, I will proceed on the basis of identity of the marks but where any goods or services were found to be identical above, they proceed under the section 5(2)(a) ground on the basis that they are similar to a very high degree.² Under the section 5(2)(b) ground, I will proceed on the basis that the goods and services found to be identical remain as such but that the marks at issue, despite being identical, are visually, aurally and conceptually similar to a very high degree.³

The average consumer and the nature of the purchasing act

42. The average consumer is deemed to be reasonably well informed and reasonably observant and circumspect. For the purpose of assessing the likelihood of confusion, it must be borne in mind that the average consumer's level of attention is likely to vary according to the category of goods or services in question: *Lloyd Schuhfabrik Meyer*, Case C-342/97.

43. In *Iconix Luxembourg Holdings SARL v Dream Pairs Europe Inc & Anor*, [2025] UKSC 25, the Supreme Court approved the comments of Arnold LJ in *Lidl Great Britain Ltd & Anor v Tesco Stores Ltd & Anor (Rev1)* [2024] EWCA Civ 262, where he pointed out that:

(a) Consumers who are ill-informed or careless, or consumers with specialised knowledge or who are excessively careful are excluded from consideration;

(b) The average consumer provides a standard which enables the courts to strike a balance between the competing interests involved, such as trade mark owners, their competitors and consumers;

(c) The average consumer is neither a single hypothetical person nor a mathematical average; assessment from the perspective of the average consumer does not involve a statistical test. There is no single meaning rule and if, having regard to the perceptions and expectations of the average consumer, the court considers that a significant proportion of the relevant public is likely to be confused, a finding of infringement may properly be made;

(d) Assessment from the perspective of the average consumer is intended to facilitate adjudication of trade mark disputes by providing an objective criterion, by promoting consistency of assessment and by enabling courts and tribunals to determine such issues so far as possible without the need for evidence;

(e) The average consumer's level of attention varies according to the category of goods or services in question; and

(f) the average consumer rarely has the opportunity to make direct comparisons between trade marks (or between trade marks and signs) and must instead rely upon the imperfect picture of the trade mark they have kept in their mind.

44. The goods and services at issue will be selected by members of the general public and business users. In respect of the latter point, I note, for example, that the specifications at issue include a range of goods that cover parts for bedding and curtains that homeware companies will select in order to make the end product of a mattress or a curtain. Regardless of their identity, the average consumer is likely to select the goods either in physical premises such as retailers (be that general or specialist) or after viewing them on a website. These are likely to be selected from lists in physical premises or via advertising on search engines, television or in print. Overall, I consider that the selection process will primarily be visual but do not discount the aural component also playing a role via word of mouth recommendations or advice from sales assistants.

45. In respect of the cost and frequency of selection for the goods and services, I find that this will vary. For example, mattresses are infrequent selections that can be relatively expensive whereas seat cushions are likely to be cheap and more frequently purchased. In terms of the level of attention paid, this will also vary because relatively cheap goods like cushions are likely to be more casual selections that attract a lower degree of attention. However, on the other end of the spectrum, mattresses are goods that are expected to last a number of years and will be used every night to sleep on so the consumer is likely to give a more elevated degree of attention, being to a relatively high degree (but not outright high). I consider the same can be said for some of the cleaning services as the consumer may select them to clean or reupholster expensive furniture meaning that care will be taken in the selection of such services. In between these two ends of the spectrum, I find that the majority of goods are ordinary consumer goods that are likely to attract a medium degree of attention.

46. In conclusion, I find that the level of attention paid for the goods and services at issue will vary between a lower (though not outright low) and relatively high degree of attention.

Distinctive character of the opponent's marks

47. In *Lloyd Schuhfabrik Meyer & Co. GmbH v Klijsen Handel BV*, Case C-342/97 the CJEU stated that:

“22. In determining the distinctive character of a mark and, accordingly, in assessing whether it is highly distinctive, the national court must make an overall assessment of the greater or lesser capacity of the mark to identify the goods or services for which it has been registered as coming from a particular undertaking, and thus to distinguish those goods or services from those of other undertakings (see, to that effect, judgment of 4 May 1999 in Joined Cases C-108/97 and C-109/97 *Windsurfing Chiemsee v Huber and Attenberger* [1999] ECR I-0000, paragraph 49).

23. In making that assessment, account should be taken, in particular, of the inherent characteristics of the mark, including the fact that it does or does not contain an element descriptive of the goods or services for which it has been registered; the market share held by the mark; how intensive, geographically widespread and long-standing use of the mark has been; the amount invested by the undertaking in promoting the mark; the proportion of the relevant section of the public which, because of the mark, identifies the goods or services as originating from a particular undertaking; and statements from chambers of commerce and industry or other trade and professional associations (see *Windsurfing Chiemsee*, paragraph 51).”

48. Registered trade marks possess varying degrees of inherent distinctive character, ranging from the very low, because they are suggestive or allusive of a

characteristic of the goods or services, to those with high inherent distinctive character, such as invented words which have no allusive qualities. The distinctiveness of marks can be enhanced through use, and I note that the opponent has filed evidence of use. I will, therefore, consider whether the opponent's evidence is sufficient to give rise to a finding that the distinctiveness of his marks has been enhanced through use. Before doing so, I will consider the inherent position.

49. The opponent's marks are all word only marks consisting of the word 'DURAFOAM'. This is not a known word in the English language but I consider that at least a significant proportion of consumers will see it as a portmanteau of the words 'durable' and 'foam'. In the context of the mattresses, cushions and upholstery services (which likely use some sort of foam) for example, consumers will make a connection between the goods and the word 'DURAFOAM'. This will not be directly descriptive because it does not actually describe such goods or services. That being said, I do consider that it is highly allusive to such goods and services, meaning that the inherent distinctiveness lies between a low and medium degree. In the context of goods that cannot be said to be made of foam (being a range of certain goods, for example), I consider that the reference to 'durable foam' will be noticed but it has no allusive qualities in this context so it will be attributed a medium degree of inherent distinctiveness.

50. I turn now to consider whether the distinctiveness of the marks has been enhanced through use. My assessment here is based on the perception of the UK consumer as at the relevant date, being 26 April 2023. Having considered the evidence, I am of the view that I can deal with this point relatively briefly. Firstly, the opponent makes a series of vague claims that the marks have been consistently and continuously used in the UK since 2017 and that due to their quality, the goods are retailed via third parties on various marketplaces such as Amazon and eBay. A list of links to these products are provided in the narrative evidence but, alongside this,

a range of screenshots have been provided.⁴ These show various goods for sale on the opponent's own website and on websites such as eBay or Amazon. While they are noted, they do not show any actual sales and, further, they are all undated, implying that they were obtained during the time period leading up to the date of the witness statement. While it is noted that scattered throughout the aforementioned screenshots are around 20 invoices covering what appears to be the sale of assorted types of foam, the opponent has made no attempt to provide any turnover figures in relation to any sales prior to the relevant date. Further, no evidence has been provided as to the opponent's market share to assist me in determining the reach of the opponent's business across the relevant public.

51. In addition to the above, the opponent has provided approximately 170 pages worth of invoices for his advertising spend in respect of Amazon and Google ads.⁵ As was the case with the invoices discussed above, this is not broken down and it has simply been left for me to review the invoices with no actual explanation as to what they actually cover or what level of exposure or sales they amounted to. The burden for proving an enhanced distinctive character lies solely on the opponent himself and it is not the job of this Tribunal to formulate his position on his behalf. Without any breakdown, I do not consider that it would be appropriate (or fair to the applicant, for that matter) for me to go through the invoices in detail and attempt to flesh out the opponent's position.

52. Lastly, the opponent has provided a series of images of the machines that he uses to cut or compress foam.⁶ I am not sure what the purpose of this evidence is but what I do know is that such evidence is in no way a demonstration of use of the 'DURAFOAM' marks so it is, therefore, of no assistance here.

53. Taking all of the above into account, I have no hesitation in finding that the opponent's evidence falls far short in proving that his marks enjoy any degree of enhanced distinctive character due to the use made of them. As such, the inherent position applies.

Likelihood of confusion

54. Confusion can be direct or indirect. Direct confusion involves the average consumer mistaking one mark for the other, while indirect confusion is where the average consumer realises the marks are not the same but puts the similarity that exists between the marks and the goods and services down to the responsible undertakings being the same or related. There is no scientific formula to apply in determining whether there is a likelihood of confusion; rather, it is a global assessment where a number of factors need to be borne in mind. The first is the interdependency principle i.e. a lesser degree of similarity between the respective trade marks may be offset by a greater degree of similarity between the respective goods and services and vice versa. As I mentioned above, it is necessary for me to keep in mind the distinctive character of the earlier marks, the average consumer for the goods and services and the nature of the purchasing process. In doing so, I must be alive to the fact that the average consumer rarely has the opportunity to make direct comparisons between trade marks and must instead rely upon the imperfect picture of them that they have retained in their mind.

55. In respect of the identity/similar of the marks and the goods and services at issue, I remind myself of the approach I have discussed at paragraphs 40 and 41 above. The average consumer for the goods and services at issue will be members of the general public at large and business users, both of which will select the goods and services via primarily visual means (though I do not discount the aural component). I have concluded that, depending on the goods and services selected, the consumer will pay between a lower (but not outright low) and a relatively high degree of attention. Lastly, the opponent's marks enjoy between a low and medium

degree of attention if viewed on foam related goods and services but, if viewed on goods or services where no such connection is made, they are distinctive to a medium degree.

56. Taking all of the above factors into account, I am satisfied that the average consumer would likely mistake all of the marks at issue for one other. This applies even where the earlier marks are only viewed as distinctive to between a low and medium degree or in circumstances where the consumer pays a higher degree of attention. I find this to be the case given the identity or very high similarity of the marks at issue and the principle of imperfect recollection. In short, there is no point of difference between the marks that would result in the consumer thinking that they were not one and the same. Consequently, I am satisfied that there is a likelihood of direct confusion between the marks at issue. Further, I consider that in line with the principle of interdependence, this finding applies even when the marks at issue are viewed on goods that are similar to only a low degree.⁷

57. The section 5(2)(a) and 5(2)(b) grounds succeed in their entirety. I will now proceed to consider the remaining grounds of opposition.

Section 5(3)

58. Section 5(3) of the Act states:

“5(3) A trade mark which –

is identical with or similar to an earlier trade mark, shall not be registered if, or to the extent that, the earlier trade mark has a reputation in the United Kingdom (or, in the case of a European Union trade mark or international trade mark (EC), in the European Union) and the use of the

later mark without due cause would take unfair advantage of, or be detrimental to, the distinctive character or repute of the earlier trade mark.”

59. The relevant case law can be found in the following judgments of the CJEU: Case C-375/97, *General Motors*, Case 252/07, *Intel*, Case C-408/01, *Adidas-Salomon*, Case C-487/07, *L’Oreal v Bellure*, Case C-323/09, *Marks and Spencer v Interflora*, Case C383/12P, *Environmental Manufacturing LLP v OHIM*. The law appears to be as follows:

(a) The reputation of a trade mark must be established in relation to the relevant section of the public as regards the goods or services for which the mark is registered; *General Motors*, paragraph 24.

(b) The trade mark for which protection is sought must be known by a significant part of that relevant public; *General Motors*, paragraph 26.

(c) It is necessary for the public when confronted with the later mark to make a link with the earlier reputed mark, which is the case where the public calls the earlier mark to mind; *Adidas Salomon*, paragraph 29 and *Intel*, paragraph 63.

(d) Whether such a link exists must be assessed globally taking account of all relevant factors, including the degree of similarity between the respective marks and between the goods/services, the extent of the overlap between the relevant consumers for those goods/services, and the strength of the earlier mark’s reputation and distinctiveness; *Intel*, paragraph 42

(e) Where a link is established, the owner of the earlier mark must also establish the existence of one or more of the types of injury set out in the section, or there is a serious likelihood that such an injury will occur in the future; *Intel*, paragraph

68; whether this is the case must also be assessed globally, taking account of all relevant factors; *Intel*, paragraph 79.

(f) Detriment to the distinctive character of the earlier mark occurs when the mark's ability to identify the goods/services for which it is registered is weakened as a result of the use of the later mark, and requires evidence of a change in the economic behaviour of the average consumer of the goods/services for which the earlier mark is registered, or a serious risk that this will happen in future; *Intel*, paragraphs 76 and 77 and *Environmental Manufacturing*, paragraph 34.

(g) The more unique the earlier mark appears, the greater the likelihood that the use of a later identical or similar mark will be detrimental to its distinctive character; *Intel*, paragraph 74.

(h) Detriment to the reputation of the earlier mark is caused when goods or services for which the later mark is used may be perceived by the public in such a way that the power of attraction of the earlier mark is reduced, and occurs particularly where the goods or services offered under the later mark have a characteristic or quality which is liable to have a negative impact of the earlier mark; *L'Oreal v Bellure NV*, paragraph 40.

(i) The advantage arising from the use by a third party of a sign similar to a mark with a reputation is an unfair advantage where it seeks to ride on the coat-tails of the senior mark in order to benefit from the power of attraction, the reputation and the prestige of that mark and to exploit, without paying any financial compensation, the marketing effort expended by the holder of the mark in order to create and maintain the mark's image. This covers, in particular, cases where, by reason of a transfer of the image of the mark or of the characteristics which it projects to the goods identified by the identical or similar sign, there is clear exploitation on the coat-tails of the mark with a reputation (*Marks and*

Spencer v Interflora, paragraph 74 and the court's answer to question 1 in *L'Oreal v Bellure*).

60. In light of what I have said above regarding the opponent's evidence, I am of the view that I can deal with this ground swiftly. Whilst reputation and enhanced distinctiveness are different, the factors relevant to both are the same. For the reasons given above when discussing the opponent's evidence, I do not consider it to be sufficient to establish the requisite reputation and the claims under this ground fall at the first hurdle.

Section 5(4)(a)

61. Section 5(4)(a) of the Act states as follows:

"5(4) A trade mark shall not be registered if, or to the extent that, its use in the United Kingdom is liable to be prevented -

a) by virtue of any rule of law (in particular, the law of passing off) protecting an unregistered trade mark or other sign used in the course of trade, where the condition in subsection (4A) is met,

aa)...

b) ...

A person thus entitled to prevent the use of a trade mark is referred to in this Act as the proprietor of "an earlier right" in relation to the trade mark".

62. Subsection (4A) of section 5 of the Act states:

“(4A) The condition mentioned in subsection (4)(a) is that the rights to the unregistered trade mark or other sign were acquired prior to the date of application for registration of the trade mark or date of the priority claimed for that application.”

63. The present ground relies on the sign ‘DURAFOAM’ in respect of the exact same goods and services relied upon under the above goods. This renders my assessment of the evidence identical to that under the section 5(2) grounds above. I appreciate that the test for a protectable goodwill under the present ground is far less onerous than the tests for an enhanced degree of distinctive character and reputation. However, for the same reasons discussed when considering enhanced distinctiveness above, I find that the evidence of the opponent is too insufficient in order to prove a sufficient level of trading activities resulting from his use of the sign. As such, this ground fails at the first hurdle.

CONCLUSION

64. The opposition succeeds in its entirety and, subject to any successful appeal against my decision, the applicant’s mark is refused registration for all of the goods and services applied for.

COSTS

65. The opponent has succeeded in opposing the applicant’s mark and is, therefore, entitled to a contribution towards his costs based upon the scale published in Tribunal Practice Notice 1/2023. In the circumstances, I appreciate that the opponent filed evidence but given what I have said about such evidence above, I am of the view that his costs associated for the same should be reduced to an amount below the lower limit set out in the aforementioned scale.

66. I award the opponent the sum of £650 as a contribution towards its costs. The sum is calculated as follows:

Filing evidence:	£200
Official fees:	£200
Total:	£650

67. I hereby order M&A Styles Ltd to pay Kazim Mohammad Hussain the sum of £650.

The above sum should be paid within 21 days of the expiry of the appeal period or, if there is an appeal, within 21 days of the conclusion of the appeal proceedings.
